Since then, never has solitude been more referred to than it is these strange days of social isolation, reclusion, seclusion, and remoteness. Therefore, we have decided to take a step back and reflect upon how solitude and commonality have been presented in written texts with a view to defining the sense of humanity, past, present, and future.

We invite the submission of individual abstracts, panels, and workshop/roundtable proposals that explore all aspects of this theme. Possible subthemes include, but are not limited to:
