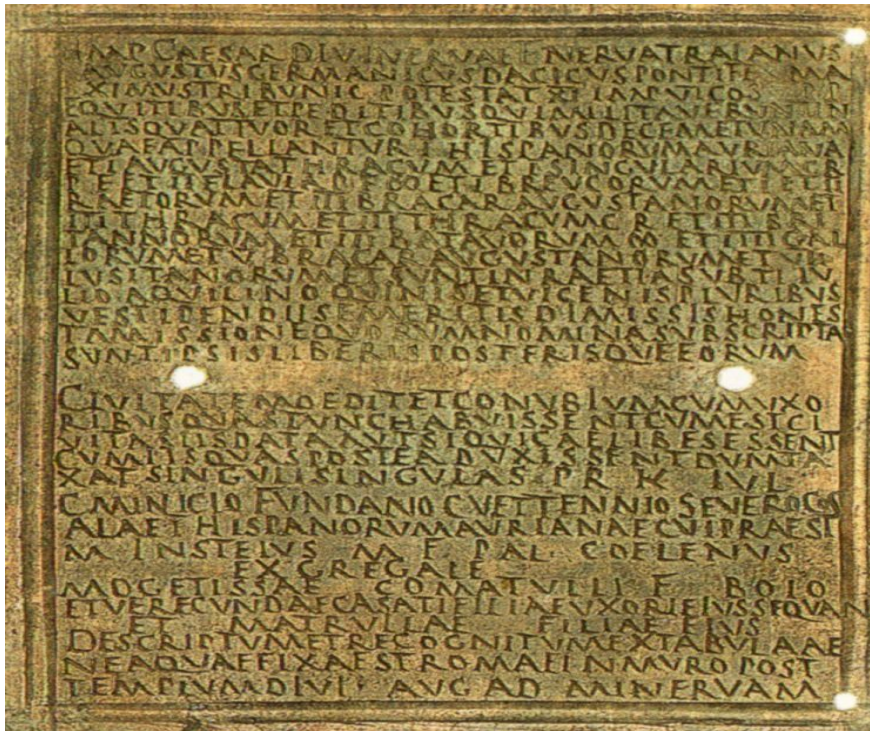

With this 11<sup>th</sup> Edition, **Under the Sign of Law**, The International Colloquium THE RECEPTION OF GRECO-LATIN ANTIQUITY IN THE EUROPEAN CULTURES enters a new decade. Law has its origins in the first civilization of Sumer. The civilization that immediately followed, Mesopotamia, gave birth to the first code of law, a work that forever cemented Hammurabi's name in history. The Persian king, Darius, created a vast empire through his legislative reforms. The Greeks have also created democracy through laws, reforms, norms, constitutions, while also innovating political science. The Romans, however, are those who perfected law, whether through reforms, laws, codes of law, or their lawmakers, which transformed Rome into an empire of justice.
